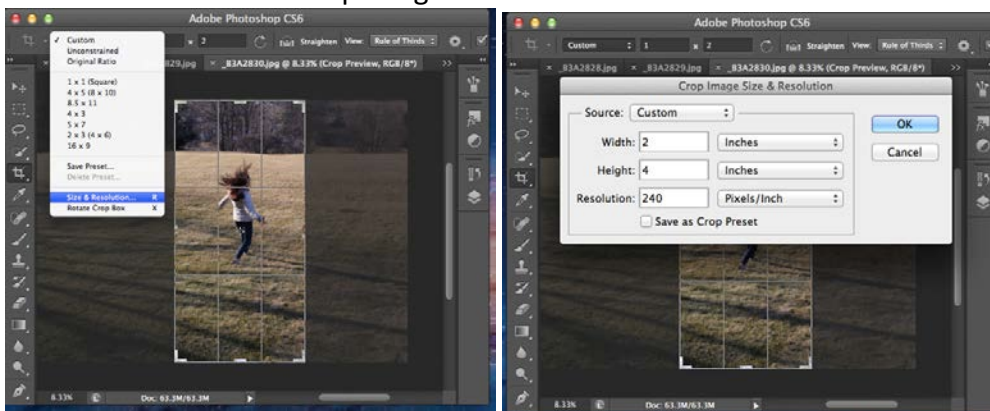


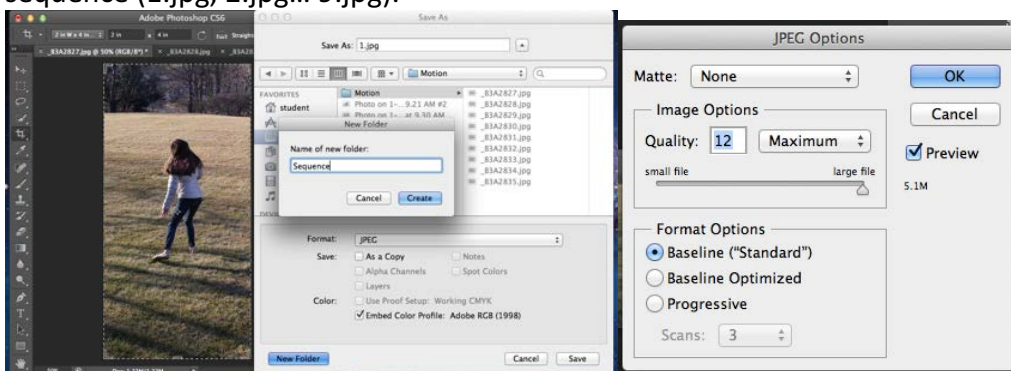
PHOTO SEQUENCE: MOTION

Photoshop Directions

1. Choose 9 sequential photographs and open in Photoshop
2. Crop each photo:
 - Select Crop tool from Tool Bar
 - Select Size & Resolution dropdown menu from Option Bar
 - Enter Width: 2 in; Height: 4 in; Resolution 240
 - Click "OK"
 - Keep crop tool level with top and bottom of image (only crop sides)
 - Double click to crop image



3. Check to make sure each photo is 2 in by 4 in with resolution of 240 (Image>Image Size)
4. Create a new folder and save each of the 9 photos as its respective number in the sequence (1.jpg, 2.jpg... 9.jpg).



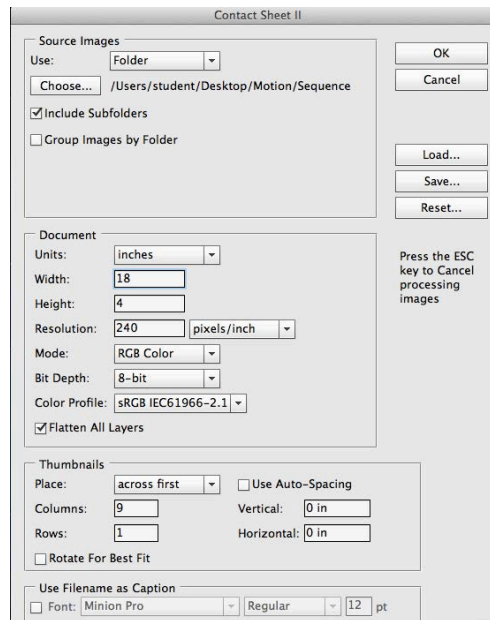
5. Once all 9 images are saved in the new folder, close the images in Photoshop

6. Create a contact sheet in Photoshop (File>Automate>Contact Sheet II).
Use the settings below:

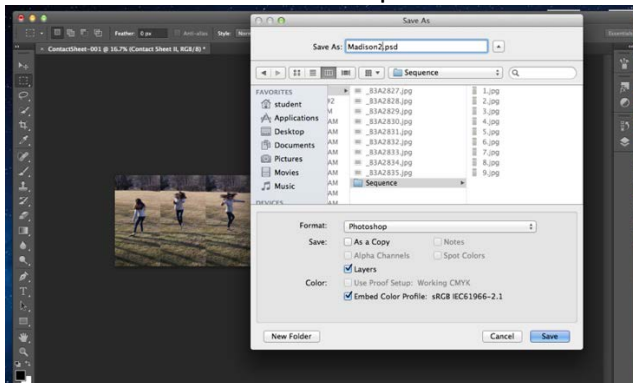
Choose folder with 9 sequence photos

Width: 18 in
Height: 4 in
Resolution: 240 pixels/ inch

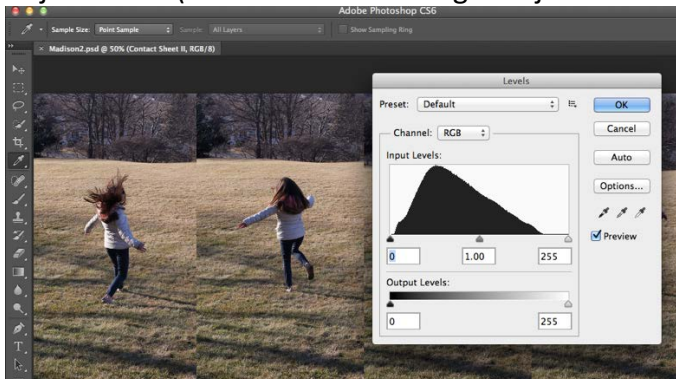
→ Uncheck “Use Auto-Spacing”
Columns: 9 Vertical: 0 in
Rows: 1 Horizontal: 0 in
Uncheck “Rotate for Best Fit”
→ Uncheck “Use Filename as Caption”



7. Save file as FirstnameBlock#.psd



8. Adjust levels (Menu Bar select Image>Adjustments>Levels or Command L)

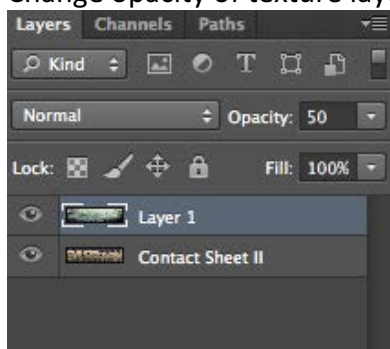


9. Save file (File>Save or Command S)

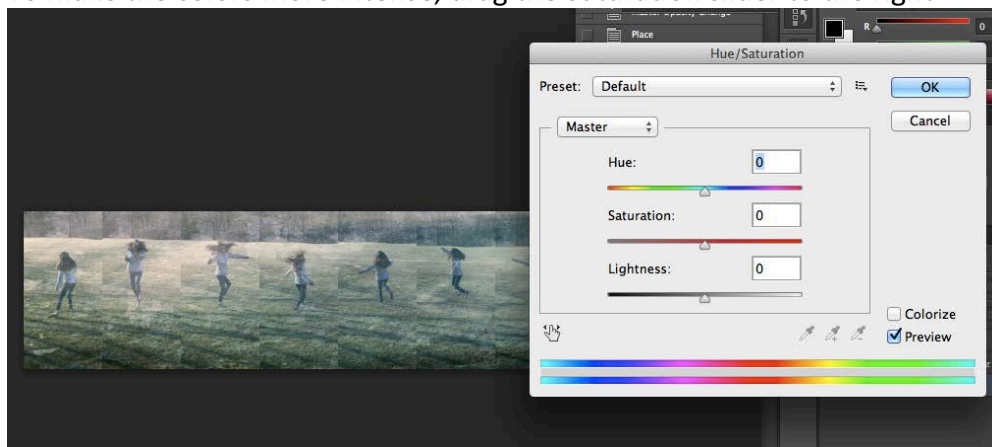
10. Open an Internet browser (Chrome or Firefox)
11. Google Image Search: "photo texture"
12. Choose an image, click "view image", drag to desktop
13. Drag texture image into Photoshop sequence document. Resize to cover whole image



14. Change opacity of texture layer to 50 or less



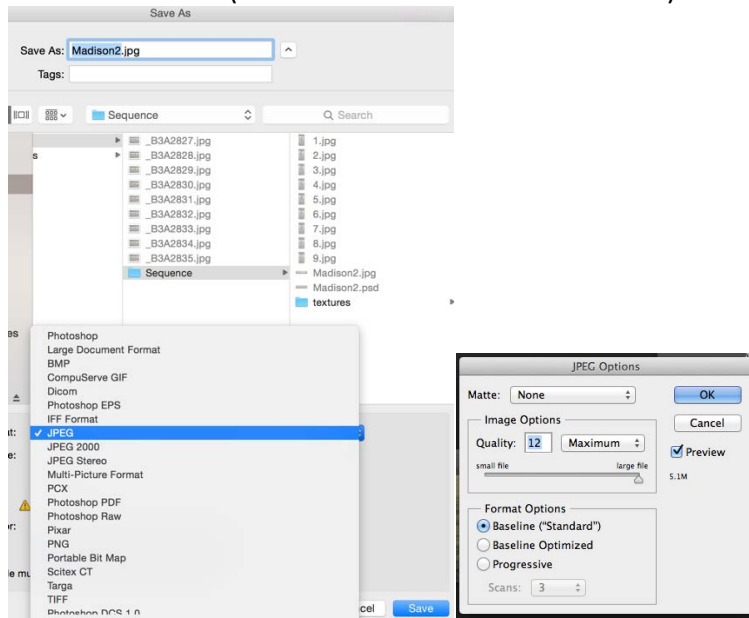
15. Adjust Hue/Saturation on Texture Layer
 (Menu Bar select Image>Adjustments>Hue/Saturation or Command U)
 To make image black & white, drag the Saturation slider the whole way to the left
 To make the colors more intense, drag the Saturation slider to the right



16. Select Photo Layer in Layer Palette
17. Adjust Hue/Saturation on Photo Layer
 (Menu Bar select Image>Adjustments>Hue/Saturation or Command U)
 To make image black & white, drag the Saturation slider the whole way to the left
 To make the colors more intense, drag the Saturation slider to the right

18. Save file (File>Save or Command S)

19. Save file as JPEG (File> Save as or Shift Command S) FirstnameBlock#.jpg



20. Check and make sure everything is correct before submitting. Image should be 18 in. by 4 in. with a resolution of 240 pixels/in (Image>Image Size)

21. Submit JPEG file to class flash drive
